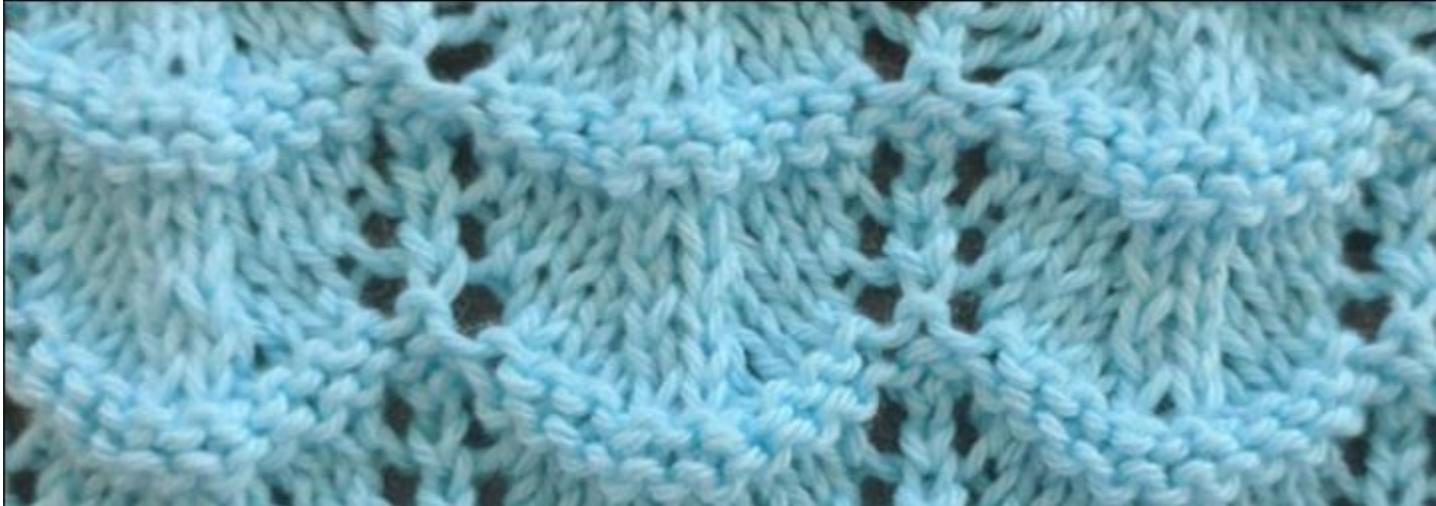


Beautiful Lacy Ripple Baby Blanket Knitting Pattern

This will be a great gift for a baby yet to come, or one of your own. A beautiful shower gift that will make you the hit of the shower. Just truly an all around fun, beautiful and easy pattern you will knit over and over again.



Delicate Ripple Knit Baby Blanket Pattern



Stitches Used:

k (knit)

p (purl)

yo (yarn over)-video below

k2tog (knit 2 together)- video below

ssk (slip, slip, knit slipped stitches together) -video below

Instructions:

Using any cast on that you love, cast on in multiples of 11+1 you control the size of your baby blanket, I used size 3 single pointed knitting needles. But you could knit on circular needles if you make it very large. And you can use any size needles, that go with the weight of yarn you choose. This yarn was acrylic baby yarn.



This is a repeating pattern of 17 rows as follows:

Row 1: *k1,yo,k3,k2tog,ssk,k3,yo,* k1 [you can see how this pattern between the *s require 11 stitches, you repeat the 11 stitches the number of times you cast on, until the last stitch then k1] This is the beauty of the ripple stitch and lace in one.

Row 2: purl

Row 3: repeat pattern row

Row 4: purl

Row 5: repeat pattern row

Row 6: purl

Row 7: purl

Row 8: knit

Row 9: purl

Row 10: Repeat pattern row.

Row 11: purl

Row 12: repeat pattern row

Row 13: purl

Row 14: repeat pattern row

Row 15: purl

Row 16: purl

Row 17: knit

Repeat these 17 rows until you have the length you like.

Row number 9 is the odd row that flips the pattern over making this a double-sided blanket. There is no wrong side. By starting the eight rows of pattern on a purl row instead of a knit row causes the pattern to reverse to the other side.

The pictures I have taken while I was making this pattern. and I added a couple extra rows for weight but have since decided it is unnecessary. But you can still see what will happen with the reversing of the sides. I like to make patterns as I knit, and sometimes I get too creative. The Blue picture is the pattern without reversing it. I was hoping you would be able to see the lace effect better.
